Health Reminders!

Please tell us if your child was sick over the weekend or if your child has any changes that we need to know about. Sometimes information as simple as a child being extra tired is valuable in our caring for him/her during the day!

We would also appreciate it if your child came to school with an injury. It helps us to know if a child came in with a boo boo that you already knew about!

Wash hands, wash hands, wash hands! When you drop your child off every day, stop at the sink as a part of your routine.

Children need to be fever free for a minimum of 24 hours without the use of a medicine such as Motrin or Tylenol that can mask a fever. Get "back up" people when children need to stay home & leaving work is difficult.
