

Summer Reading 2011-2012

Incoming Grade 4

Every student is required to read 2 books
~ 1 book is assigned and 1 book is self selected ~

Read over the summer to keep skills sharp!!
One project is due on the first day of school, August 29

Book 1 – assigned title– all students read this
“Tales Of A Fourth Grade Nothing” by Judy Blume
Read this book only, nothing to make – test in September

Book 2 – choose your own book!
Read this book and do one project

**Note: For the self selected book, each student is expected to choose a grade-appropriate book. We ask that you do not choose a book that has themes that would not be appropriate for school (i.e. violent books or books about witchcraft or sorcery; for example, Pokemon or Harry Potter themes) We would encourage choosing books that promote Christian values.*

There are NO Summer BOOK REPORTS assigned for Grades 2 and up for Summer 2011

Bring one completed project on the first day of school. Points will be deducted for each day the assignment is overdue. This assignment will be graded and given the weight of one reading test in the first marking period.

Bring a total of ONE project on the first day of school

4 PROJECT CHOICES (select *one* based on your self selected book):

- Advertisement poster or brochure to attract others to read book OR
 - Poster should have at least 5 facts about the book
- Cartoon strip that summarizes the events of the book OR
 - Cartoon should have at least 5 facts about the book
- Diorama or other 3D representation of the book OR
 - Diorama should have at least 5 facts about the book
- Puppet of one of the characters – include a written description of 3 events that the character was involved in
