

Kindergarten Summer Reading Projects 2011

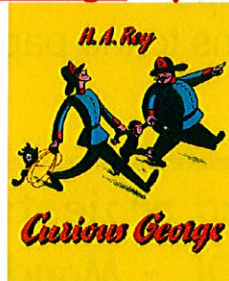

Curious George by H. A. Rey

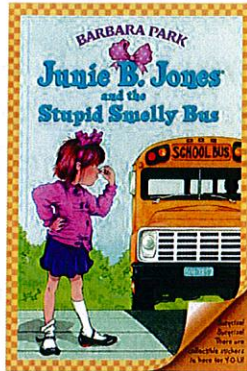


PROJECT to do for "Curious George"

Project to do for “Junie B Jones....”

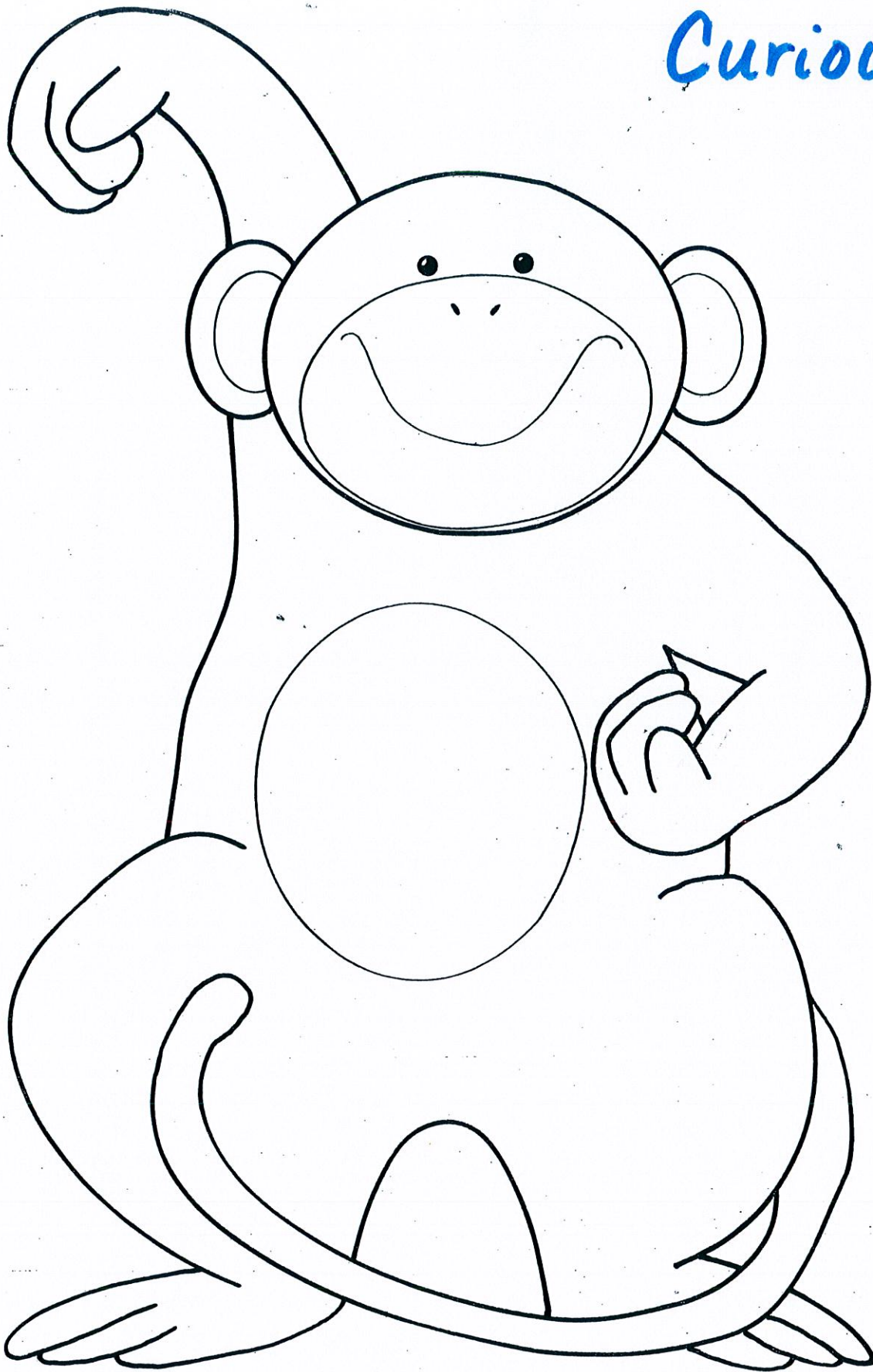
WRITING PAPER IS ATTACHED TO THIS PACKET ☺
